10. D. W. Cummins vs. J. L. Hanna, action for money; B. F. Jones for plaintiff; Oscar Hayter for defendant. Jury trial; nonsuit on motion of defendant at close of plaintiff's case.
22. Walter L. Toose vs. A. G. Lineback et al, action for money; W. L. Toose, Jr., for plaintiff. Verdict for plaintiff against A. G. Lineback for \$101.88 and for defendant Rida Lineback. Judgment on verdict.
