

Rainfall at Albany.
The total rainfall recorded at Albany during 1909 by F. M. French, United States Weather Observer, was 43.31 inches. This is a little more than the average rainfall at Albany. The light rainfall in the spring was counterbalanced by a remarkably wet November. The rainfall by months was as follows: January, 8.77 inches; February, 7.62; March, 1.81; April, .56; May, 1.32; June, .22; July, 1.34; August, .30; September, .93; October, 3.82; November, 11.86; December, 4.76.
