IS LAST CONTEST

Results of the spelling contest for schools of two or more rooms, held April 22, 1910, as reported by Superintendent Seymour:

Fourth Grade—First place, Dallas, 99 and two-sevenths per cent; second place, Falls City, 96 per cent; third place, Monmouth, 93 per cent.

Fifth Grade—First place, Buena Vista, 100 per cent; second place, Falls City, 99 and five-eighths per cent; third place, Dallas, 99 and four-ninths per cent.

Sixth Grade—First place, Dallas, 96 and one-half per cent; second place, Bethel, 95 per cent; third place Falls City, 91 per cent.

Seventh Grade—First place, Ballston, 96 per cent; second place, Monmouth, 94 and five-sevenths per cent; third place, Dallas, 93 and six-elevenths per cent.

Eighth Grade—First place, Ballston, 94 per cent; second place, Dallas, 93 per cent; third place, Buena Vista.

Several schools which did not receive any of the first places in the different grades made grades that are very close to those mentioned in the first three places and the work is much better than at the beginning of the school year.
