Saturday night the city council held a special session for the purpose of opening sealed bids for the sale of sewer bonds as advertised in the Independence Enterprise. The bid of S. A. Kean & Co. of Chicago was accepted. This bid carries a premium of twenty cents a hundred. The details necessary to the sale are now being prepared and the money will be in the hands of the council within thirty days.

Another special session of the council was held Monday night when an ordinance was adopted dealing with the tax levy necessary for the payment of interest on and retiring of the sewer bonds.
