FORTNIGHT OF ENTERTAINMENT

Albany is to have a Chautauqua assembly this year. On July 8 to 17 that city expects to present some of the finest talent of the Chautauqua platform, among whom are Gov. Folk of Missouri who on the last day of the chautauqua meet will give his great address, "The Era of Conscience". Another is Col. George W. Bain of Kentucky, who will speak Sunday, July 10. Charles Howard Plattburg of West Virginia, an orator who has recently come into prominence, will deliver his great address, "Worms Beneath the Bark". There are other orators of note expected. Among the musical entertainments to visit Albany in connection with the chautauqua are the Fisher Shipp Concert Company which will open the chautauqua on Friday, July 15, and which is to continue for four days and nights in plays and novelties of a high order. Edwin Brush, a master of legerdemain, Ross Crane, the cartoonist, singer, mud-mudler, piano player and all-round entertainer, who comes on for two consecutive nights, July 13 and 14.

The site of the chautauqua is Bryant's Park within almost a stone's throw of the business district of the city where by a short walk of five minutes the most delightful conditions of shade, waterfall, sylvan retreat, picturesque walks, boating, etc., may be reached. The Calapooia and Willam rivers skirt the grounds on three sides. Fresh water from the city water works will be piped over the grounds for the use of campers, and the roadways, tent grounds and assembly tent will be beautifully illuminated with electric lights.

IMPROVING RURAL SCHOOL.

Much Care Should Be Given to the Class Rooms.

How about the schoolhouse in your town? What sort of class room is provided for your son or daughter to work in five or six hours per day? Do you know whether fresh air is admitted or prohibited in that room? Do you know whether the room is properly cleaned or is it germ laden with sweepings? And, if you don't know, why don't you know?

Why do you watch your child's scholastic progress as shown in weekly or monthly reports from the teacher and neglect to ask what care is given to his body from 9 to 12 and from 1:30 to 3:30 five days each week?

If you heard that little Jimmie Brown, who sits at the desk next to your son, was carrying diphtheria germs from the bedside of his sick father into that class room you would be the first to appear before the city physician or board of health to file a complaint. Well, Jimmie's father has a disease just as infectious—tuberculosis—and Jimmie Brown is carrying into that close, unventilated class room tuberculosis germs in his clothing.

Why don't you do something to prevent such dangerous contact for your boy?

Why don't you demand in your town notification and registration for the father and fumigation and segregation for the son? What right have you as an intelligent father or mother to let your child take such chances?

These are straight-from-the-shoulder questions which you as a parent should consider and answer. They contain the reason for physical examination of school children. This does not work a hardship on the few, and it does save the many.
