DIES FROM A FIT OF ANGER

The following Albany dispatch to the Oregonian of the 14th inst. gives account of the death of W. J. Crabtree, father of Mrs. Wm. Kurre of this city:

While in a quarrel last evening over school matters, W. J. Crabtree, a well-known Linn county pioneer, seventy-one years old, was attacked with heart failure and dropped dead, at his home near Crabtree. Mr. Crabtree had suffered with heart trouble for some time and this attack was superinduced by excitement and anger.

There had been trouble in the Crabtree school over the payment of the teacher, Mrs. Freda Dart Hiron, and the teacher's husband, William Hiron, was discussing the matter with Mr. Crabtree, chairman of the school board, when the latter became angry. According to the story of a witness, Crabtree picked up two rocks, which Hiron took away from him. Crabtree again picked up a rock and for the second time, Hiron took it away from him and just as he did so Crabtree fell over dead.

No blame for Crabtree's sudden death is attached to Hiron, as he is said to have used only sufficient force to take away the rocks and was not touching Crabtree when the attack of heart failure came. After taking away the rocks the first time, Hiron remarked that as he was a young man and Crabtree was an old one he would not strike him.

Mr. Crabtree, a native of Missouri, was among the earliest pioneers of Linn county, crossing the plains to Oregon with his parents in 1847. He is survived by his widow and three daughters: Mrs. Isa Dickinson, who lives in Washington; a married daughter living at Independence and a girl living at home.
