

WILL REMODEL DOG ORDINANCE

The city council met in regular session Wednesday night with Councilmen Mix and Moore absent. Little business was transacted owing to the absence of these councilmen whose presence was desired for action on matters which should have come up at this meeting of the council.

The council directed the city marshal to notify all property owners and business men to clean up the streets in front of their property that the town may present a better appearance next week on the occasion of the horse show and race meet. This is especially desired in the business districts of the city.

A matter which will likely come up at the next meeting of the council is that of restricting dogs from running at large in the city. An ordinance will likely be ordered drafted dealing with the matter. Owing to the numerous cases of hydrophobia which are reported throughout the

country many of the Willamette valley towns have passed ordinances restricting dogs from running at large. Adjournment was taken until Monday night, pending the return of the absent councilmen.

Taft Opens Big Tract.

PORTLAND.—The President has signed a proclamation eliminating 203,635 acres from the Willowa National forest, Oregon. The elimination is the result of a careful examination made by the United States Department of Agriculture during the past Summer, which disclosed the fact that the areas now eliminated were either open grass land with very little timber or timbered areas so largely alienated that further administration by the Forest Service was considered impracticable. The lands released are not needed for watershed protection, and are not considered to be chiefly valuable for National forest purposes. The unappropriated portions of the areas eliminated by this proclamation will be restored to settlement and entry after having been advertised in the local papers by the Secretary of the Interior.
