The state railroad commission has issued an order designating July 5 as the date for hearing in the matter of the operating methods of the Portland Railway, Light & Power company on its Portland city lines.

Jefferson Myers, a prominent Portland citizen, and ex-president of the State Lewis and Clark Exposition Commission, has announced his caudidacy for the democratic primary nomination for governor.

Sentence of Jefferson W. Scriber, ex-cashier of the Farmers & Traders' National Bank at La Grande, who was convicted in the United States cour! of wrecking that institution, has been postponed for the second time.

The lumber industry of Wallowa is daily becoming a more important fac tor in the growth of the town. From a paltry shipment of 22 cars in the last 12 months, the exportation promises to reach nearly 20,000,000 feet during the coming year.

Dr. Arthur C. Boggess, who for several years past has beld the chair of history and economics at Pacific university, will not be connected with the school next year, but will probably leave for India to take up missionary

Clackamas county republicans will hold an assembly in Oregon City Saturday, July 16, to elect 55 delegates to the state assembly and transact such other business as may legally and regularly come before the dele-

Preparations are being made for the opening of the season at Crater Lake park. Oregon's great wonder has again been ignored by congress The appropriation for the year is \$3000. This sum will pay the salary of the superintendent and permit replacing the bridges.

The people of Curry county are discussing the matter of having a new courthouse. The present courthouse has been in use for about 35 years and is too small for the present business of the county, which has doubled in the past five years, and the officials need more room.

Hearing of the suits of the Eastern Oregon Land company, owning the old Dalles military wagon road grant through the north central portion of the state, against the Willow Creek Land & Irrigation company and the Malheur Valley railroad has been postponed in the United States court until July 1.

Assistant Attorney-General I. H. Van Winkle has announced that he will be a candidate to succees George H. Burnett as circuit judge in case Judge Burnett is not again a candidate. It is pretty well understood that Judge Burnett will be a candidate for the supreme bench.

Action regarding the proposed can cellation of the state's Carey act contracts with the Deschutes Irrigation & Power company was postponed at a meeting of the desert land board in Salem until the next meeting of the board, which will be about the middle of July.

At a meeting of the Northwestern Oregon Forest Fire association held in Portland, officers were elected and plans made for a more efficient fire protection. The association embraces Columbia, Clatsop, Washington and Tillamook counties and is known as district No. 1.


