## OREGON STOCK GETS NOTICE

The following is from the Jersey Bulletin and Dairy World, one of the most prominent publications of the kind in the United States:

It is a gratification at Burr Oak Jersey Farm to receive the following from our pleased customers:

Mr. John B. Stump writes: "The Jerseys came through all right; in fact, in extra good shape. We are certainly pleased, and must thank you for your fair treatment. They have been wonderfully well received here and we are very proud of them."

Mr. Ross H. Nelson writes: "Arrived with the cattle in fine shape; took me twelve days to make the trip. Not one got hurt. They all ate well on the trip and were feeling so good that the boys could hardly lead them home. The cattle are attracting lots of attention here and there isn't a day passes that some one is not out to see them. I thank you for the many favors shown us."

I am not surprised that Messrs. Stump and Nelson were pleased, as I never saw a handsomer lot of Jerseys; and as they lined up in the car, twenty heifers of same size and type, standing between two splendid young bulls, it was a sight to make any

Jerseyman's heart glad. The heifers are by the most prominent sires on the Island and all safe in calf to their best young bulls.

The importation was made for Mr. John B. Stump of Monmouth, Oregon, and Mr. Ross Nelson of Independence, Oregon. These gentlemen are interested in the upbuilding of their state along agricultural lines, and deserve great credit for their enterprise in bringing these high-priced cattle such a distance at great risk and outlay. Over three thousand miles by rail, after a sea-journey of that distance without a mishap, is due to the careful handling of Mr. Nelson, who received them from quarantine at Boston; and further to the fact that Jerseys are in reality very hardy and not the delicate animals that our competitors would like to make people believe.

The young bulls in this importation will do much to improve the dairy quality and Jersey type in Oregon. Both are out of butter test cows. Mr. Stump's choice is by the great young sire Oxford Majesty, now at the head of Mr. Chas. Mourant's herd. Those who have seen the bushel-basket full of gold and silver medals won by Mr. Mourant's Jerseys will know what it means to refer to a sire as his herd bull. The dam of Mr. Stump's bull is W. J. Mallett's best cow, Egmont 2d, one of the really great cows of the breed.

Mr. Nelson's bull is by Sir James, a promising young sire strong in Leda's Golden Lad blood, and his dam is Pretty Dolly, Mr. J. P. Romeril's brag butter test cow. These bulls will be heard from in the great northwest.

Mr. Stump sends me the following, taken from the Independence Enterprise, a local paper, which explains itself:

Harry West of Scappoose was lately visiting at the homes of Messrs. Nelson and Stump to inspect the fine Jerseys which these gentlemen have just received direct from Jersey Island, and said: "I have traveled considerably over the United States during the last month, and what I have seen of the Jerseys at the farm of these two gentlemen are equal if not superior to anything in this country."

"You have a good country. I have

been here several times before and it looks good to me. I have been all over the east and there is no country in all my travels that I would trade Oregon for. While in the east I bought thirty-two head of Jerseys which I now have on my farm at Scappoose. Quite a number of these are imported, while others are from imported sires and dams."—W. R. The Oregon Democrat Publishing company filed articles of incorporation yesterday with the county clerk. The incorporators are A. Goodwin Betts, F. J. Clarke and C. F. Houston. The capital stock of the new company is placed at \$100,000, and the principal place of business is Portland. In addition to the general powers of conducting business, owning real estate and suing in courts, the articles give the new company the power to own, conduct and operate a general printing and publishing business in all its departments; to own, operate and publish a morning daily newspaper to be known as the Oregon Daily Democrat, and to buy, own, acquire and lease a news service or news services.—Telegram.
