The big liner was gay with flags and ringing with shouted good-byes when the shooting occurred. Most of those who had been aboard the ship to say farewell to friends or relatives had gone ashore, but a little group remained to talk with the mayor. They were standing on the port side of the vessel, near the promenade deck forward, and were in the act of posing for a group photograph when Gallagher, the would-be assassin, unnoticed pushed his way almost to the mayor's side and fired point blank at his head. The man Gallagher is locked in a cell at Jersey City, held withoutbail. He expresses no remorse.




