NEW PHONE LINE

A short time ago it was announced through the columns of the Enterprise that the Pacific Telephone & Telegraph Co. would in a short time rebuild their exchanges at Independence and Monmouth.

Mr. Shenefield, the local manager, says that several tons of wire, cable and other material, also several car loads of poles have been received here and that W. S. Snyder, one of the company's competent foremen who has just finished the rebuilding of the toll lines between here and Salem, has his men at work here and that work is progressing rapidly on these new plants.

When completed the plants will stand second to none of their size. The old plants will be entirely removed, new poles will replace the ones now in use, cables will replace the present wires and the very latest types of common battery switchboards and telephones will give service in place of the present equip-

ment. All of the houses will be re-wired so that nothing but the best will be in evidence when the work is completed and the new plant placed in service.

These improvements by the telephone company are in line with the general spirit of progressiveness now in evidence in Independence, such as the laying of the sewer system by the city of Independence, the building of our high school and the erection of handsome business blocks and residences by local capital and it should be gratifying to the people of Independence to have the telephone people show their faith in Independence in such a substantial manner. Telephone appliances are very expensive and the fact that such complete and up to date plants are to be installed here shows that Independence is looked upon as one of the substantial valley towns by the telephone people.
