NOTICE OF MEETING OF BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.

Notice is hereby given that on Monday, the 17th day of October, 1910, the board of equalization will meet at the county court house at

the city of Dallas, in the county of Polk, state of Oregon, to examine and correct the assessment rolls, to correct all errors in valuations, descriptions or quantities of land, lots, or other property or incorrectly assessed as to description or quantity,

or when assessed in the name of a person or persons not the owner thereof or assessed under or beyond the actual cash value thereof and to assess all lands, lots and other property appearing to have been omitted or that was not assessed.

Petitions or applications for the reduction of a particular assessment shall be made in writing verified by the oath of the applicant or his attorney, and be filed with the board during the first week it is by law required to be in session, and any petition or application not so made, verified, and filed shall not be considered or acted upon by the board.

Free Roads Across Reservation.

PENDLETON.—After several years' fight, the stockmen of Umatilla county, assisted by the county court and the business men of this community, have secured free roads across the Umatilla Indian reservation, according to an order just received by Major Swartzlander, the local agent, from the department of Indian affairs at Washington. The order specifies that the roads shall be taken over by the county court, maintained as county roads, and that stockmen shall give bonds not to consume more than a certain length of time in driving their stock across the reservation and to be responsible for any damages inflicted by their stock.

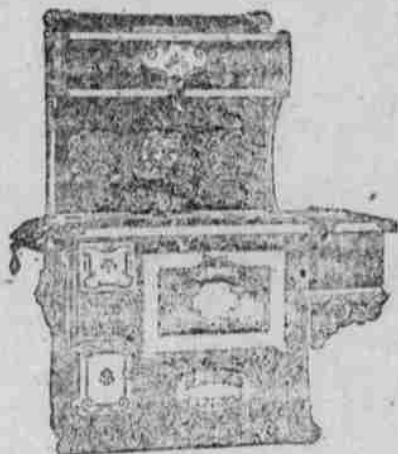
