The taxes due to the saloon must be paid by the taxpayers. Each coun ty must pay according to the assessed valuation. The taxable property of Polk county is \$13,052,420. Of this \$11,038,770, or 85 per cent, is out-side of the cities. Under the license system the cities get the license money and are the causes of most all the expense.
