DOES LIQUOR TRAFFIC PAY?

It was estimated that for one year the sum of \$1,850,000,000 was spent directly for alcoholic liquors. Add to this the indirect expense and the computation that 1,500,000 men and women are daily either mentally or physically disabled for work as the result of drinking; then let us add the additional expense of the judiciary, the police force, the jails, the prisons, the poorhouses and the asylums; the value of grain wasted and the labor used in the manufacture and sale of alcoholic beverages, then the total cost of strong drink to the nation, in dollars and cents, cannot be less than \$3,500,000,000 annually.

Now think for a little over these items of expenditure, and make a comparison:

From these figures you will note that the consumption of liquor has decreased and that prohibition, which has been the cause of this decrease, does truly prohibit.

As Realized in Oregon

The 1909-10 budget for the state penitentiary is \$159,142. Eighty-five per cent of this, according to Warden James, is due to liquor. The asylum costs \$911,324. Fifty per cent of the insanity is due to liquor. The court and officers expense in civil courts due to liquor for two years is \$858,330. Add these amounts together and the total expense of the liquor traffic for Oregon is as follows:
For penitentiary .. \$135,270
For asylum .. 455,862
For court and police exp., .. 858,330

Total cost of saloon for two years .. \$1,449,262
Total revenues from saloons for two years .. 512,002

The actual cost of liquor traffic to taxpayers of state, \$937,262

As to Our County

The taxes due to the saloon must be paid by the taxpayers. Each county must pay according to the assessed valuation. The taxable property of Polk county is \$13,052,420. Of this \$11,038,770, or 85 per cent, is outside of the cities. Under the license system the cities get the license money and are the causes of most all the expense. But the farmer must pay 85 per cent of all this expense. The saloon is a curse to the farmer financially as well as in every other way. Then to think that the "Greater Oregon Home Ruin Association" wants to rob the farmer of having a right to help knock out the saloon. It is a travesty of justice. 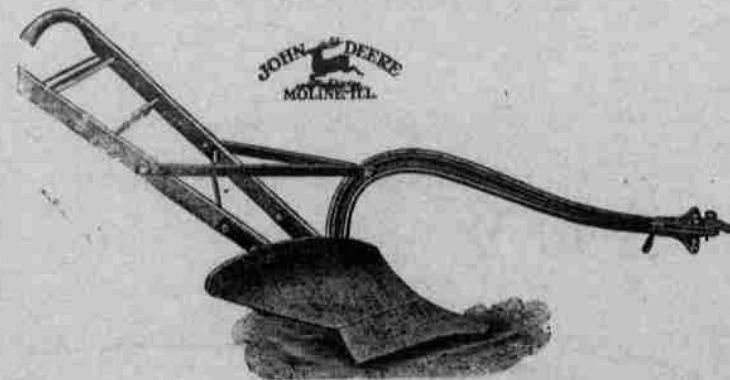
