

HIGH SCHOOL FUND CARRIES

The following vote on the high school fund, which is the result at the election last week, shows how the people of the county feel toward the high school. The outlying districts, it will be seen, with the exception of South Falls City, South Monmouth and a few other precincts, voted against the measure. It is surprising that the measure should have suffered at the hands of the voters and it can be explained only in the belief that they were not properly informed on the subject. This fund of money would be available only for the purpose for which it was voted.

The subject was well and masterfully handled in the Independence Enterprise an issue or two before the election, by County Superintendent Seymour and almost every voter in the county got a copy of the paper. They must have followed the advice of the Enterprise and voted down the measure because they were not thoroughly informed on it.

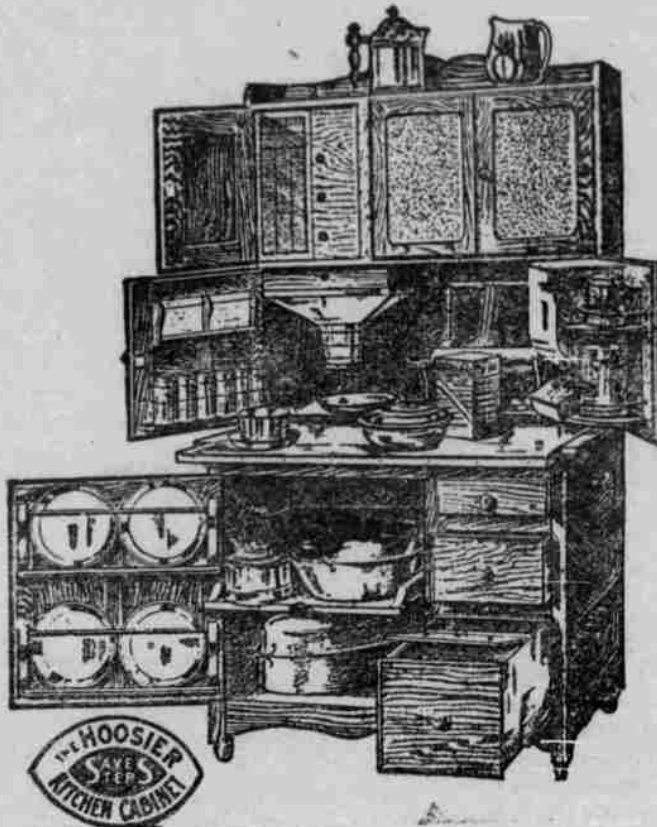
