POLK COUNTY BOY HONORED

The people of Polk county will be pleased to learn that Carle Abrams, who was elected as state representative from Marion county at the last election is a native of Polk county. He is well known throughout the county, and especially in Dallas, and in the west end of the county where he spent the greater portion of his life. He is a son of the late L. Abrams, the pioneer merchant of Lincoln.

Mr. Abrams was educated at the Oregon Agricultural College in Corvallis and it was while attending that school that the war broke out with Spain and he enlisted in the volunteer army, serving with distinction in the Philippines for two years. He is now captain of the Salem militia company. He made his home continuously in Polk county until accepting a position with the Daily Statesman of Salem, about seven years ago, and is now a stockholder in that concern.

Mr. Abrams is a young man of much promise, and is at present manager of the Pacific Homestead at Salem, one of the leading farm journals of the Pacific coast. Under his management the Pacific Homestead has made rapid strides. His ability has pushed him forward in the many positions of honor and trust during his residence in Salem.

His entire life has been spent in dealing with farmers and studying conditions on the farm, so he will be in a position to champion the interests of the tillers of the soil during the next session of the legislature. The esteem with which he is held by the farming community is shown by the splendid vote given him in the county districts of Marion county, and by the fact that for two years he has been secretary-treasurer of the Or-

egon State Dairy Association, the largest organization of farmers in Oregon.
