NEWS PARAGRAPHS FROM OTHER CITIES IN OREGON

New big power plant will be erected this year on the Rogar River near Prospect.

The commissioner of lighthouses has authorized advertising for selling the bathing privileges on the Yaquina Bay lighthouse reservation.

Twohy Brothers, the well known contracting firm, have almost completed their part of the \$1,250,000 improvement work between Pendleton and Yoskin.

United States District Attorney John McCourt of Portland filed the papers which inaugurated condemnation proceedings against block S, to be used as the new postoffice site.

Three of the four children of R. E. Grossheim, a former resident of Umatilla County, were taken to death in a recent Sasatchewan blizzard, while the mother and fourth child will lose a leg.

Sixteen more boys than girls were born in Linn County during 1914. Complete statistics for the last year show 419 births in that county during the year. Of this number 213 were boys and 197 girls.

Senator Chamberlain has been appointed representative of the Masonic Grand Lodge of Oregon at the meeting of the Degree, Washington Memorial Association to be held at Alexandria, Va., February 22.

Halls will be held into Madras, 111 miles south of the Columbia River on the Oregon Trunk Line, early in February, and John F. Stevens, president of the road, has set February 10 as the date of entry into that city.

The Libby coal mine, three miles from Marshfield and owned by the Oregon Coal & Navigation Co., has been closed, after being operated for more than 25 years. It was in former years one of the big sources of employment in that locality.

Albany's new city directory has been issued. In his statement the publisher gives the city by actual count, January 1, a population of 5166. The additions adjacent to and receiving city privileges have 642 people, making the total population 6129.

What is considered one of the biggest moves yet attempted toward further development of Eastern Oregon will be incorporated in a bill to be introduced by Senator McCulloch asking for the creation of a third water division to consist of Baker, Harney and Malheur Counties.

Within the last four years the office of the county clerk of Jackson County has changed from a burden upon the taxpayers to one of the revenue producers among the county offices, according to a statement in course of compilation by County Clerk William R. Coleman.

The contract for the substructure of the Broadway bridge at Portland was awarded formally to the Union Bridge & Construction Company, of Leavenworth, Kans., for \$557,845.80, by the executive board. The contract will require the work shall be completed by January 1, 1915.

A recount of The Dalles' population has just been finished, the latest returns giving 5714 as the real population. The men making the count are willing to swear to these figures. The government census returns gave 4880, and the citizens think they are justified in making the recount.

All central Oregon is rejoicing over the arrival at Coleman of the track laying crews of both the Hill and Harriman lines. This means that central Oregon is soon to be thrown open by railroad communication, to the outside districts and promises a great future to this big territory in the Deschutes valley.

Louis W. Hill, president of the Great Northern Railroad, who arrived in Portland in his private car, will not go to California, as anticipated, but will go to Salem to see what plans the legislature has regarding encouraging Oregon colonization. He will also look over Willamette Valley properties in which the Hills are interested.

Allow but \$25,000 for the Astoria Centennial celebration instead of \$100,000, as asked in Lester's Senate Bill reported back with the decrease, created a storm of opposition from many of the senators, and the report was finally recommitted with the instructions that \$100,000 be incorporated as the appropriation.

In a communication to the Chief Forester, Department of Agriculture, and to Senator Chamberlain, Governor West has proposed a novel plan

for disposing of small tracts of land aggregating 4500 acres, owned by Oregon within the National forests of that state. The Governor proposes that an arrangement be made to select a compact tract in the Cascade National Forest in the central part of the state, so that a state forest reserve can be created by an exchange of lands. Probably legislation will be necessary to carry the arrangement into effect.
