BRIEF NEWS OF THE WEEK

The workmen's compensation act passed both houses of the Kansas Legislature.

The Iowa House sustained Governor Carroll's veto of the Oregon primary plan bill.

Although reduced Pullman berth rates have been in effect since February 1, passenger traffic officials on lines entering Chicago declare there has been no appreciable increase in the demand for upper berths.

The California Assembly passed by unanimous vote the bill repealing the present primary law and substituting simplified method of primary elections with the Oregon provision for the state-wide vote for United States senators.

The federal income tax memorial to Congress was killed by the Utah House of Representatives. The Senate had adopted it unanimously.

The estate of Mrs. Mary Baker G. Eddy in New Hampshire is valued at \$2,512,146, according to an appraiser's report. Henry Baker, executor of the will of the founder of Christian Science, estimated that the Massachusetts property was worth \$250,000 additional.

President Taft is settled in temporary quarters at Augusta, Ga., and a private telegraph operator supplies him with messages from the Mexican frontier.

Billy Papke, the American middleweight, knocked out Dave Smith, the Australian middleweight champion, in the seventh round at Sydney, Australia.

WASHINGTON, D. C., NOTES

Appropriations at the last session of Congress aggregated \$1,025,489,662.

President Taft has appointed former Senator Cockrell, of Missouri, as commissioner on the part of the United States to retrace and definitely determine the boundary line between Texas and Mexico.

Walter L. Fisher on Monday took the oath of office as secretary of the Interior, succeeding Richard A. Ballinger.

Representative Oscar W. Underwood of Alabama, who is to head the new ways and means committee, made it clear in an interview that any notion which may be entertained by the President or his friends that the Democratic leaders of the House will not take up the tariff at the coming extra session of Congress, is wrong.

The progressives have won their fight for committee recognition in the Senate, and will be accorded good places. One of the prices they will pay, however, will be that they will have to be content with Boies Penrose of Pennsylvania as chairman of the finance committee, the most dignified position in the United States Senate. It was held by Aldrich.

FOREIGN NEWS BITS

The trial of the 41 members of the Neapolitan Camarero, which has terrorized Italy for many years, has begun.

A caucus of Canadian Liberals decided that the reciprocity agreement with the United States be confirmed by Parliament as soon as it is possible to reach a final vote.

With its 35,000-ton affair at Hamburg and one of 40,000 tons' capacity building at Kiel, Germany will have the two largest drydocks in the world.
