## EASTER SUNDAY

Christian people in a'l parts of the w rld are making preparations for the observance of that great event commonly known as Easter, which, this year, will occur next Sunday.

Differe t a tior tes have different views as to the origin of the word, or name, Easter. It seems to have no raal sign fi ance of its own with that which i is associated, but it is of S xon origin and a derivation from Ast rie, the name of a heathen goddees to whom sacrifices were offered at the time of the spring equin:x during t e ful moon, and at the same time also of the Jewish feast of the passover, a thou h having no connection the ewith. The resurrection of Chris. or u red at the same time on Sunday, the il st day of the week, In commemoration of that event the chr stian church instituted at an eary period, the fe st to which the name Easter was given in preference to passover, prohably for the reason tha, at the time of its i stitution the church was composed in gey of Gentile corports, and because of the general provailing sent mean that the Jewish economy had been entirely abolished.

But without going in o detail as to its true origin, the event we celebrate today, all things considered, is of the greatest importa ce of anything in human history, not excepting birth of Christ, although that the event is more gen rally observed.




