TOWN FLOODED WITH MELONS
 Last Monday a car load of melons from Southern Oregon was side-tracked in Independence. None of the dealers knew it was coming but all took advantage of the opportunity the over supply presented. During the entire season, up to the present time, melons have been selling for from 35 to 50 cents but when the car was unloaded signs appeared to the effect that melons were worth no more than 20 cents. Cookey, Walker and Lehman took a wagon-load and Reeves, Drexler & Alexander, Cook and Knox handled about the same amount.
 It seemed at first that melons would be on hand for the rest of the season unless a negro misfeetrol should appear, but the next morning the melons left would not have attracted much attention.
 During the summer Mr. Winters has been buying melons in Salem and in this way the local market has been supplied. This season Mr. Winters handled fifty thousand pounds of them but will not bring in any more this year.


Notice of Meeting of Board of Equalization
 Notice is hereby given that on Monday, the 16th day of October, 1911, the Board of Equalization will meet at the County Courthouse in the city of Dallas, in the county of Polk, State of Oregon, to examine and correct all assessment rolls, to correct all errors in valuation, lots or other property, or incorrectly assessed as to description or quantity, or where assessed in the name of a person not the owner thereof or assessed under or beyond the actual cash value thereof, and to assess all lands, lots and other property appearing to have been omitted or that was not assessed.
 Petitions or applications for the reduction of a particular assessment shall be made in writing, verified by the oath of the applicant or his attorney and be filed with the board during the first week it is by law required to be in session, and any petition or application not so made, verified and filed shall not be considered or acted upon by the board.
