Brief News of the Week.

If a saloonkeeper sells a man liquor and the man, becoming intoxicated, smashes up the saloonkeeper's goods, the saloonist alone is responsible, according to a ruling by Judge Tyner, of New Haven.

Nine balloons, representing the United States, Germany and France, are entered in the international race for the James Gordon Bennett trophy, which is scheduled to start from Kansas City.

One of the gravest problems that has ever confronted this government has just arisen in the increasing frequency with which young officers who have received their education at West Point or Annapolis leave the service. Where there were formerly 10 applicants for entry, there is now but one.

Amazing figures given out by the government show that the worth of all the golden eggs ever laid by the fabled goose is overshadowed beyond measure by the American hen. Her annual contribution to the wealth of the country exceeds \$500,000,000. It equals the value of the wheat crop, according to government experts.

The natural increase of population in Ireland is still insufficient to meet the steady drain of emigration. The official figures for 1910 just issued show an excess of 27,786 births over deaths, while 32,547 Irish men, women and children sought homes elsewhere. Thus there was a decrease in the total population of 5883, as compared with the previous year.

News of Noted Persons.

Aviator Fowler abandoned his transcontinental flight owing to the fact that his engine will not carry him over the Sierras.

President Taft's travels during the week will carry him from the Missouri River to the Pacific Coast. He left Omaha Monday morning and will reach Spokane Saturday night.

George H. Earle was elected the Republican nominee for mayor of Philadelphia. According to the count his majority will be about 25,000. Earle was Senator Penrose's candidate.

Governor Dix, of New York, granted a pardon to Peter C. Hains, Jr., formerly a captain in the United States coast artillery, who was serving an indeterminate sentence of 14 years for killing William E. Annis August, 1908.

The investigation into the election of Senator Stephenson of Wisconsin opened in Milwaukee Monday, though it will probably be a week or more before the taking of testimony begins. The investigation will be conducted by a congressional committee of which Senator Heyburn of Idaho is chairman.

Among the changes made in the management of the Harriman lines in the West the most important decided upon was the selection of J. D. Farrell, now vice-president in charge of the Puget Sound extension, as president of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation Company, with headquarters in Portland, Ore.

Swedish Cabinet Resigns.
Stockholm.—The Swedish cabinet, headed by Premier Lindman, resigned. The ministers tendered their resignations to the king because the general election held last Wednesday resulted adversely to the government.
