Agriculture in the Far East

O. A. C., CORVALLIS, ORE., Nov.16 .-At the November meeting of the Agricultural Club of the Oregon Agricultural College, Dr. J. R. N. Bell. formerly of Independence, described the agriculture of the Far East as he noted it in his recent trip abroad. The program also included a talk by Moichi Kawashima of Tokyo, Japan, on "Seattle Markets;" a discussion of horticulture by Paul Mehl of Chicago, and a musical selection by C. L. leorge of Portland and Luther McGinnis of Corvallis.

In his address Dr. Bell dwelt particularly on the great opportunities for agricultural development in Russia and Siberia. In 1881 only 260 pec ple applied to go to Siberia, while last year about 6,000,000 applied to the government for supplies for that purpose. Each person is given, by the government, \$51.50 in cash and a like amount in supplies.
