Sealed bids will be received by the undersigned, Secretary of the Board of Regents of the Oregon Normal School, until 2 o'clock p. m., on the 18th day of March, 1912, for fifty (50) cords of 4 ft. oak wood, to be delivered at the Oregon Normal School building on or before July 1, 1912. Bids to state the price per cord corded in basement, and second, price per cord put in basement and not corded.

Also bids for 120 cords of slab wood delivered at the Oregon Normal School on or before July 1, 1912, but not put in basement. All cording to be done without bulk heads. All bids must be accompanied by a certified check of five per cent of the amount of the bid as a guarantee that the successful bidder will enter into a contract according to the aforesaid specifications. Said check to be made payable to the Oregon Normal School. If for any reason the bidder fails to execute the proper contract within ten (10) days after notification of the acceptance of his bid, then said check will become forfeited to the Oregon Normal School.
