NOTICE TO OWNERS OF DOGS

You are hereby notified that the City Council has passed an ordinance No. 156, requiring all owners of dogs in Independence, Oregon, to pay for and take out a license for each dog owned or kept within said city; said license must be paid for and taken out by the 1st day of April, 1912. All dogs found within said city after said date, without a license having been issued therefore as provided in said ordinance, will be impounded by the city marshal, and sold or killed. The ordinance further provides that any person keeping a dog within said city without having taken out a license as therein provided shall be subject to a fine of not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$50.00, or imprisonment in the city jail not less than 5 nor more than 25 days. Said license will be issued by the city recorder. Don't fail to call and get said license by the 1st of April, 1912.
