Simplifying the Drama.

"No one who has seen a play staged out of doors at night, where the darkness eliminates all need of wing pieces and proscenium, where the characters grow into the sight or melt out of it, can fail to have been impressed by the heightened, almost dreamlike, illusion," writes Walter Prichard Eaton in the American Magazine. "If, now, you hang in front of a suggestively painted backdrop—a real picture—some negative draperies on either side, eliminating formal wing pieces and sharp edges; if you light this picture from behind the draperies, so that to the audience they tell rather as folds of shadow, leaving between your actors and the audience a transparent region of darkness, as it were, an intangible glass of illusion, you have achieved an effect of possible beauty and increased suggestiveness by the simplest of means. Certainly, by some such method, the production of Shakespeare could be greatly simplified, many of the scenes now omitted restored to the acting text, the 'waits' cut down, narrative made more coherent and rapid."

AVERAGE BELOW THE NORMAL. Examinations by Experts Show That Criminals Usually Show Arrested Physical Development.

Sixty Frenchmen condemned to death for murder have been examined with special reference to their muscular development. Their ages varied widely. There were four of 17, ten of 19, nine of 21, eight between 22 and 25, fifteen between 26 and 30, twelve between 31 and 40; two were more than 50.

The majority belonged to the massive muscular type, all parts of the body except the chest being highly developed. But there was an unexpectedly large proportion—11 out of the 30—who must be classed as cerebral; that is to say, who were muscularly puny but of acute intelligence. These had committed crimes that needed no muscular effort, most of them having killed women by shooting with revolvers.

The experts who examined these murderers deduced from these statistics that the criminal tendencies of homicides are generally the result of arrested or distorted development arising between the ages of 15 and 20.

NO CHANCE FOR SHORT NAP. This Home-Made Alarm Clock is Guaranteed to Bring Drowsiest Mortal From His Bed.

Many a man who hates to get up in the morning—and who doesn't—has often thought of attaching his alarm clock to an electric bell in such a way that this should ring until he got up and stopped it. Several ways of doing this have been devised, but all of them involve some modification of the clock itself.

The Scientific American, however, tells of a plan devised by a Frenchman, which any one can make, as it involves no mechanical skill and no "monkeying with the clock."

All that is needed is to put the clock on a shelf or the cover of a box, the shelf having a main flat part of the clock and in front a sloping part of the shelf. On the sloping part a metal bar is laid, and below it are two contacts such as screws or nails, so that when the alarm goes off the vibration of the shelf will cause the bar to slide down till it touches the nails, to which are attached the electric wires. This completes the circuit and sets off the bell. An alternative scheme is to pivot the bar at one end, with a contact stud lying below the other end. In this case one wire is connected to the bar and the other to the stud, so that the bar swings down and makes contact. The battery and electric bell can be placed inside the box, and the top is used for the shelf. An electric lamp above the clock may complete the outfit.

This apparatus is warranted to awaken the heaviest sleeper and to get the worst sluggard out of bed, for even the laziest of men cannot lie in bed long and listen to an electric bell ringing insistently in their ears. They must get up to stop it, for it will keep right on until they do, or until the battery that runs the bell is exhausted.

GAUGED BY SIZE OF FAMILY. Honor is Accorded Heads of Households Commensurate With Number Under One Roof.

The Chinese are proud of large families, and a large family living together under one roof is looked upon as a proof of the good temper and correct course of life of its members, and as a sure path to prosperity. A large family which is able to live together without dividing up the property always receives much credit and is highly respected. It is one of the highest distinctions in China to have Wu Fu Tung Tang, or five generations under one roof, although such a distinction is attained by very few.

According to a recent census, the family of Meng Yu Shih, a widow, of the village of Mangtao, in the territory of Weihsaiwei, has the distinction of being the largest in the land. Her family consists of 66 members, and with one servant there are 67 mouths to be fed daily. Meng Yu Shih is 66 years old and has nine sons and numerous grandchildren and great-grandchildren, all living under her roof. She has not yet attained the ambition of being the head of Wu Fu Tung Tang, but the size of her family has already given her the honor and pleasure of being the largest in the entire kingdom, even if she has not five generations under one roof.
