Doings of the World at Large Told in Brief.

General Resume of Important Events Presented in Condensed Form for Our Busy Readers.

The import price of coffee is steadily rising.

Mexican federals captured and shot a millionaire Mexican accused of treason.

The court has ruled all evidence of attempted bribery admissible in the Darrow trial.

San Diego, Cal., is likely to be placed under martial law until the I. W. W. troubles are settled.

Moorish forces made a fierce attack on the French garrison at Fez, but were beaten off with the help of artillery.

Thieves stole \$1,000 in gold from a private safety deposit box in the county court house at Portland, and left no clew.

A \$1 gold nugget was found in the crop of a chicken at Medford, Or. The chicken came from Gold Hill, Or., and now all chickens from that locality are eagerly sought for.

President Gomez, of Cuba, expressed his gratitude to President Taft for the assurance that there is at present no intention to interfere with the affairs of the island.

Sixteen girls employed by the Ladies' Home Journal in Philadelphia were discharged for indulging in the "turkey trot" and other objectionable dances during their noon hour.
