PREMIUM LIST GROWING. Many Donations Made to Help Land Products Show. Portland—Fifteen thousand fruit trees, the number of donations to the premium list for the Pacific Northwest Land Products show [which were predicted by Manager G. E. A. Bond, have already been offered by nurseries of the Pacific Coast.

RAINFALL UNIQUE. Hood River Valley Soaked by Record August Precipitation. Hood River—The rains that fell over the valley here last week are unique in the annals of weather records here.

SEASON BEST IN TEN YEARS. All Morrow Crops Are Promising Well. Heppner—Never in the history of Morrow county have the crop prospects been as good as they are this year.

POLLINATION BULLETIN IS OUT. Experiment Station Prints Circular on Apples and Pears. Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis—A seven-page bulletin, No. 20, on "The Pollination Question" has just come from the press at the Oregon Agricultural college.

Honey Rates Too High, Charged. Salem—Beekeepers of Eastern Oregon have filed a complaint with the State Railway commission that freight rates on honey are too high and that as a result there is no chance for Eastern Oregon beekeepers to attempt to compete with the California product.

Teach Scientific Laundering. Oregon Agricultural College, Corvallis—A course on scientific laundering is to be given by Miss Margaret McCall of Albany, O. A. C. '12, at the Oregon Agricultural college this year.

Compare Systems of Printing. Salem—Declaring that his office is receiving many inquiries as to the relative merits of the old fee system and the proposed flat salary system in the matter of operating the state printing plant, Governor West has made a formal request of State Printing Expert R. A. Harris that he furnish a report showing the cost of operating the plant under the present fee system, wherein it appears the state is paying excessive charges, and what saving will be made under the new law if approved by the people at the next election.

Big Umatilla Wheat Yield. Freewater—The yield of wheat in this part of the valley is said to be enormous. At the state line Sam and E. P. Ingle are farming 530 acres and have a yield of 25,000 bushels of wheat, making 40 bushels to the acre.

Klamath Gets New Train Service. Klamath Falls—The new train between this city and Red Bluff, Cal., is proving a great convenience to the traveling public. It leaves Klamath Falls at 8 o'clock a. m. and arrives at Red Bluff at 5:55 p. m., where it connects with a train for Sacramento.
