Notice is hereby given that on Monday, the 21st day of October, 1912, the Board of Equalization will meet at the County Court House in the City of Dallas, in the County of Polk, State of Oregon, to examine and correct all assessment rolls, to correct all errors in valuation of lots or other property, or incorrectly assessed as to description or quantity, or where assessed in the name of a person not the owner thereof, or assessed under or beyond the actual value thereof, and to assess all lands, lots or other property appearing to have been omitted or that was not assessed.

Petitions or applications for the reduction of a particular assessment shall be made in writing, verified by oath of the applicant or his attorney, and be filed with the board during the first week it is by law required to be in session, and any petition or application not so made, verified and filed shall not be considered or acted upon by the board.
