### LETTER FROM RALF FLOYD

U. S. S. Transport Sheridan June 14

Dearest Mother and Everybody:—

Have just left Honolulu after spending a most delightful day and night which gave us ample time to give the Island the once over. We hired a car and drove out through the rural districts, through large sugar cane and pineapple plantations. The cane was just being harvested and the pineapples were just turning ripe. Our drive took us out to Seabird Barracks, (about 30 miles) we had paved road all the way and it being morning, the air was cool and fresh. We spent some time at the barracks and then returned. When arriving back to Honolulu it was time to "chow," so we went aboard our transport and partook of a very wholesome meal; our appetites being sharpened by the morning's drive. After lunch we took another drive to the palaces, one of the mountain peaks, where the King of the Honolulu tribe with most of his followers were driven over a bluff of some 500 feet high by another and stronger tribe from one of the other Islands. While at the palace we noticed the contrast in the temperature of the air. In the city it was very warm and here it was cool and raining. We had come from sunshine to rain, which prevails the year around, thus giving Honolulu her fresh water supply. Leaving the Palace we descended the mountain leaving rain and clouds behind emerging into the beautiful sunshine again with a light sea breeze laden with the scents of many beautiful tropical flowers.

Driving through the beautiful residential section of Honolulu we soon came to the acquarium where we saw many beautiful fish of all sizes, shapes and forms. Then we visited the fish that was in full blast when we landed. There were many things of interest here in the way of tropical grains and fruits. It was very warm so we did not stay long but hastened our footsteps toward the world's famous beach which was only a block away (we had dismissed our car) before reaching the beach we passed the beautiful hotel Waiolu, which is built on the beach. We were much disappointed in the beach as it was not near as beautiful as we expected. There were many coral reefs which insisted in peeling up swimmers' shins and knees. Our transport sailed at 2 o'clock p. m., so it was too late for us to take a dip much to our disappointment. When we landed we expected to stay two days, but the time had been changed at the last minute to a day and a night, thus spoiling our chances to see the Island and swim too. Leaving the beach we took a street car back to the city and shoved aboard our transport with our next stop some 4000 miles distant, (Valdevostock Russia.) Before the
