WRITER OFFERS COURSE ON FARM ADVERTISING

Value and Methods of Using Home Paper to Sell Surplus Produce Announced for Farmers Week

A short course on using the home newspaper to sell surplus farm produce will be offered farmers attending farmers week at the college,Dec 29th and January 3rd, by C. J. Mc-Intosh, farmer, farm writer and exnewspaper man.

"I have known farmers to pay a local commission man \$50 to se! 100 tons of alfalfa at \$20 a ton, when they could have sold it by paying the editor a dollar," said Mr. McIntosh in anouncing the course. "They could then have kept the extra \$49. credited it to the buyer or split it with him. I asked why not advertise and sell direct, and they said, "why, I never thought of it."

"Not only the advantage but the method of using the home paper will be considered. The success of the advertisement depends on the facts selected for announcement, the form in which they are stated, and the rep utation of the advertiser, All of these-except the last-will be explained and so far as possible dem-

Specimen advertisements that have been business-getters with results are wanted for this course.

Using the home press is not only profitable business but sound public policy as well, Mr. McIntosh asserts. These papers help farm production by running many a farm story that enables the farmer to increase or protect his crops, and are fairly entitled to a share of the paid news matter-advertising.

Editors generally like to run as news items farm stories of unusual yield, odd and interesting farm happenings and community enterprises and thec ourse will show how this matter may be handled to mutual ad-
