School Notes

OREGON NORMAL NOTES

The official announcements for the Summer School are ready for distribution. The usual six weeks' term will be held this year, beginning June 21, 1920. The first day will be devoted to enrollment and classes will be organized June 22. The regular members of the faculty will be the instructors and will offer practically all the courses offered during the regular session.

In addition, courses in special methods will be offered: (a) In the different subjects for all grades from 1 to 8 inclusive; (b) For rural schools; (c) For principals and superintendents. In the elementary teachers' training course all the subjects required by law for such a course will be given. Many prominent people will give special lectures during the session. Indications point to a large, successful Summer School.

President Ackerman has accepted an invitation to speak this week in a local teachers' meeting at Mountain View. This meeting is under the direction of Superintendent Cannon of Benton county.

Work was resumed in the Monmouth Training School on Tuesday, after the school had been closed one week on account of influenza.

There have been no new cases of influenza among the students for two weeks. Practically all who were ill have recovered and returned to work.

Miss Edna Mills, Head of the Department of Household Economics, has been given a leave of absence for the remainder of the term on account

of ill health. Miss Evangeline Poley of O. A. C. is substituting for her.

The members of the faculty were dinner guests of the Misses Todd.

The students have been most enthusiastic in the observance of the National Week of Song, February 22 to 29. All America is singing this week and it is pleasant to have even a small part in this music "of the people, by the people and for the people." A detailed program of songs for the chapel hour each day was planned. Miss Stalley introduced the work for the week on Monday morning by giving a history of the movement, its aims and benefits, and spoke of the inspiration in feeling that the Oregon Normal is singing the same songs at the same time as all other schools, organizations and communities in the United States. Miss Ruth Brown handled the music program devoted to American folk songs, giving interesting facts about each. Miss Mary Wilson took charge on Tuesday and the school sang the beautiful popular songs of other nations. She invested each song with a new interest by giving a brief history of it. Wednesday such songs as are used in "community sings" were taken up. On Thursday Miss Booth enthusiastically prepared the way for the group of college songs chosen for the day, which were sung with good spirit. Friday morning the "Pilgrims' Chorus" by Wagner, "Send Out Thy Light" by Gounod, Handel's "Largo," and the "Soldiers' Chorus" from Faust were sung. Miss Hargreaves made explanatory remarks concerning them. The orchestra ably assisted each morning.

The public is invited to join in the community singing before the motion picture which is to be given this week.
