OREGON AFFAIRS TERSELY TOLD

The only worsted mill west of the Ohio river is in Oregon.
Ice cream cones were first invented and made in Oregon.

Fifty per cent of the hops grown in the United States are produced in Oregon.
Silverton—Silverton Blow Pipe company installing complete new foundry and additional building at cost of \$15,000.
Astoria—Largest chimney on lower Columbia completed for Pacific Power & Light company, in Young's bay, 221 feet high.
Asea—A carload of fir logs has just been shipped from here to New York, where it is to be used for veneer material.
Portland—Ten wooden vessels built in the Portland district have just been selected for the trans-Atlantic coal trade.
La Grande—The Canyon Lumber company, a newly organized concern, is shortly to operate a mill near Ladd Canyon about ten miles from here. Timber resources of the three partners interested are extensive.
Portland—Plans are being completed in the east for the factory building and warehouse of the American Can company, to be erected in Portland. A site adjoining the Montgomery Ward property was recently purchased.
Preparatory to the building of seven 12,000 ton steel tankers at the yards of the Northwest Bridge & Iron company, steel plates are now being rolled in the east. The first keel will probably be laid in 60 days.
Klamath Falls—Second to none on the coast is the planing mill to be erected here by the Lakeside Lumber company. To carry out the extensive plans outlined a reorganization of the corporation has been effected and the board of directors increased.
Portland—School teachers in several parts of the state have written the Associated Industries office saying they have found the new business directory issued by the organization handy as a geography text book. It is found useful in illustrating the kind of products from each section of the state.
Portland—Veneers shipped all over the United States by the Portland Manufacturing company at St. Johns are in such demand that the plant is doubling its capacity and making additions to the present building. The company has been in operation about two years.
Portland—On a six acre tract recently purchased in north Portland by the Sterrett Packing company a new \$400,000 plant is soon due to rise. The concern has an annual output of a million dollars worth of meats. Plans for the new building have already been approved and construction will begin before July 1.

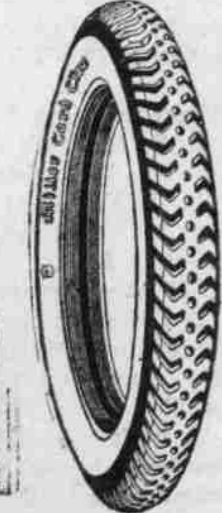
