



WORLD WHEAT SUPPLY SHORT

PRICES WILL BE RIGH IN OPIN-ION OF BRITISH FOOD CON-TROLLER.

As harvest begins, the question interesting the whole world is whether the food supply will be adequate and whether prices will fall. Wheat prospects in Europe have improved, and crops generally are declared good, though short in Spain and southern Italy, but in the United States the crop is 41,000,000 bushels below the average for five years, Argentina's surplus has been exhausted and a prohibitive export tax has been imposed, Australia has censed experce and though India has what would normally be a surplus of 48,000,000 bushels, her people have become so presperous that they are expected to consume all of it. Russia has ceased to export and under botshevist rule produces 40 per cent less than her own needs, but Siberia of fers exports to the Pacific coast.

The prospect may be summed up in the opinion of the British food controller that there will be a world shortage of wheat and that prices will be high. Widespread destruction, loss of fertility, high wages and labor's demand for short hours will not permit early return to the pre-war scale of production in Europe. Russia is not likely to return to the list of exporting nations until belshevism has fallen, until a stable government has been formed until the ravages of war and revolution have been repaired or until agriculture has been modernized. That may not be for a decade.

Apart from these causes which spring from the war, others were at work before it began which tend to establish a permanently higher level of food values. The vast area of Africa will be developed by the white race in cooperation since military colonization has ended with the extinction of Germany as a colonial power.

The reserves of land available for food production are thus so great that the world needs but to turn its energies from war to their development in order to keep the bread basket full. This process will become more rapid as the world's transportation system by land and water is reorganized, for the troubles of the last few years have arisen rather from breakdown of the machinery of distribution than from deficiency of total supply.-Oregonian.
