



WASHINGTON, May 14 .- An ugly crisis has been reached in the negotiations between the United States and Great Britian looking to the adoption of uniform regulations for the government of the seal fisheries this season. The British government positively refuses to re-enact the regulations of last year, which prohibited the carrying of firearms by sealing vessels through the sea north of the 25th parallel during the closed season. The United States officials look upon this as disastrous to the seal fisheries.
