



FRUIT SHIPMENT FOR 1895.

The Oregon Fruit Union's Summary—Results Manifest at Close of Season.

The total number of pounds of green fruit shipped through the Oregon Fruit union the past season amounts to 2,127,558, and the total prune is the most profitable shippaid the growers amounts to \$32,- per. While it has not the flavor 182.25 or an average of 1 cents per pound.

The fruit shipments began May 10th with a crace of strawberries. shipped from Milton to Denver. 2569 crates of strawberries were

shipped and the total remitted to always pays well. growers amounting to \$2,312.10 is an average of 90c per crate. Hood River, 1,927 crates, average

per crate realized by growers, \$1.73 per ctate.

Milton shipped 3,925 crates, total amount remitted, \$3,477.83. or 88 2-3c per crate.

The Dalles shipped 375 crates, netting the growers an average of

\$1.69 per crate. Total strawberries shipped, 8,769 crates, or 11 car loads.

Strawberries were shipped to Montana, Utah, Colorado and Wyoquantity to Omaha. 2,500 boxes of cherries were ship-

ped averaging to the grower 40c per 10 pound box. Black Republican proved to be the better shipper for long distance.

Eight cars, containing 7,057 crates, or 141,140 pounds of peach plums were shipped, netting to the growers, \$951.61, or six-tenths per pound. Two of the cars were from Douglas county, the halance from

Of the silver prones 2,078 crates and 927 boxes were shipped or 60,-420 pounds; these averaged net

ped, mostly Bartletts. Pear shipments proved unsatisfactory and box of 40 pounds. The pears were very scabby this year. Most shipments of Oregon Bartletts proved very disappointing, notwithstand-Californian pears. But this is the hardest fruit to pack and it was almost impossible for the growers to understand that they must be shipped when green. Many pears sent to ship when in riper condition than they should have been on arrival in Eastern markets.

Three full carloads of grapes and one partial car were shipped. Two cars from Klickitat county did not carry well, the owner of the grapes in Omaha received them. The grapes would mould and rot, and much pains were taken in shipping. care being taken in packing only the firm solid grapes. No actual loss was occasioned, but they were not successful shipments.

One car of German prunes, a car of Italian and Silver prunes; and one car of mixed plums, crab apples and apples, which were shipped without due knowledge proved loss-es to the growers. In the instance of the German, Italian and Silver prunes, the fruit was soft and ripe. The car of Italians and Silvers on

When the crates of prunes were full and well packed the growers were able to realize good prices. While the inexperienced pack and hauling on the part of a great many caused them to realize considerable less than an average of 11 cents per pound. The shipment of the Italian prune green has proved beyond a doubt its excellent qualities as a shipping fruit. The last ship-

The Silver prune is not so good a shipper. Being light colored it shows the bruises more plainly and such bruises causing dark spots on the fruit which is a detriment to good sales. However some sales of good solid fruits were equal to the Italians. But the colored fruit is always preferred. The Hungarian prune yet it possesses all the keeping qualities of the Italian besides being much larger and of more attractive color, which alone sells it. and shipments of Hungarian prunes

The neccessary pains and care is not understood by the generality of the fruit growers. The Eastern receiving houses who find it necessary to use large spring trucks with rubber tires in hauling the fruit from the car to the sale rooms, fruit at this end was hauled five miles in a dead axle wagon.

The grower must also appreciate the fact that Eastern buyers who have bought California varieties of fruit for years packed by professional packers will buy our Oregon oming points, and a considerable fruit with more caution and at a less price, until he knows by actual experience the keeping qualities and flavor as compared with what he has been handling,-Salem Statesman.
