DEAD MAN FOUND

IN THE RIVER BOTTOM NEAR BUENA VISTA THIS MORNING.

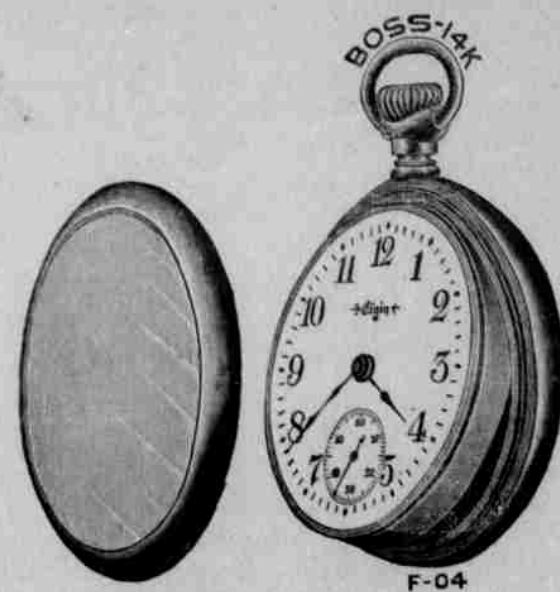
