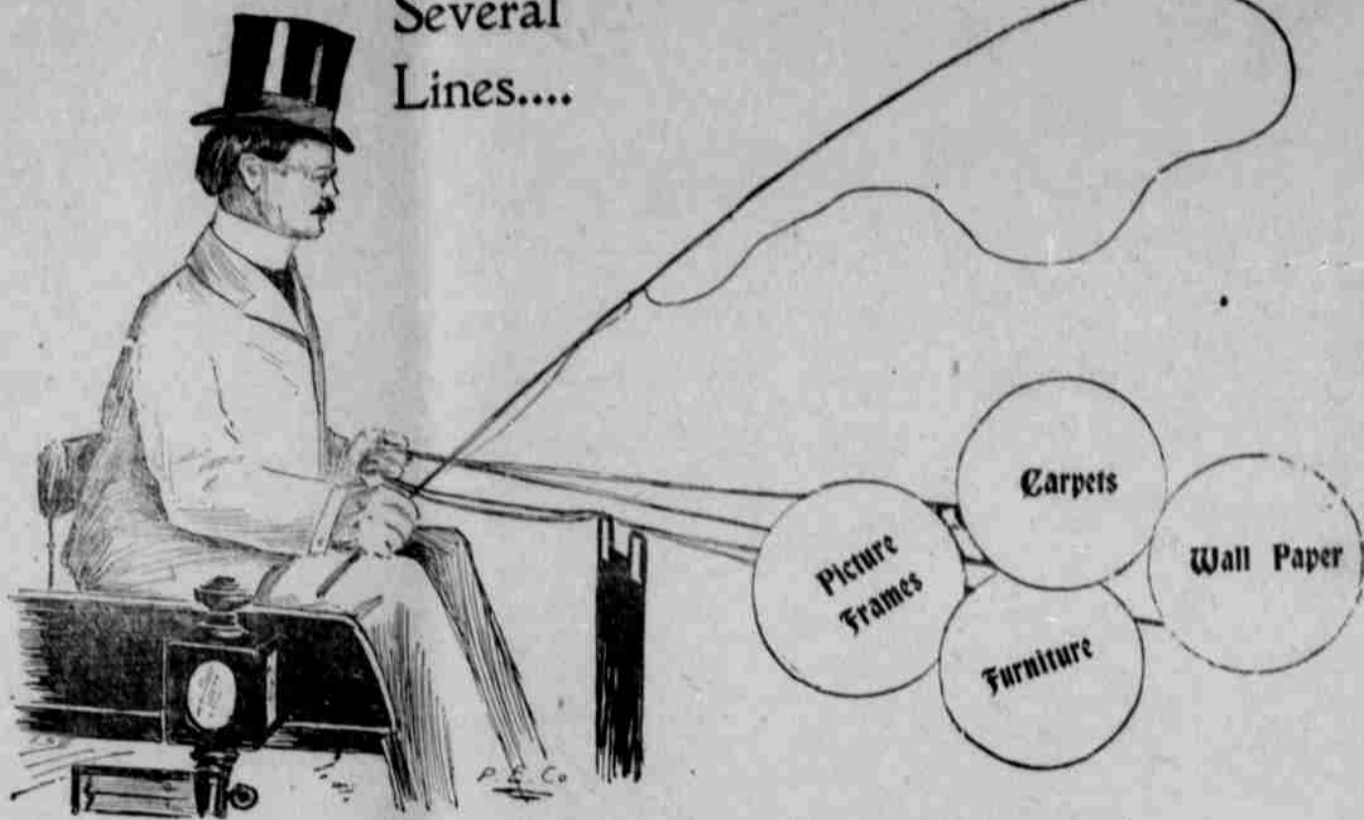
John Kirkland, of Independence was a business visitor here Sunday.
