

ANGORA GOAT SHOW.

Fourth Annual Exhibition to be Held at Dallas in January.

The fourth annual Angora goat show for the state of Oregon will be held in Dallas, Polk county, Oregon, on Wednesday and Thursday, January 14 and 15, 1903, under the auspices of the Polk county Mohair Association. The show will be open to visitors in the evening of both days. Diplomas will be given to all prize winners. No entrance fee will be charged and feed will be furnished to exhibitors free. The executive committee for the exposition is composed of U. S. Grant, W. A. Ayres and H. L. Fenton, all of Dallas.

There will be two grades of goats eligible for entry. The registered in one class, and unregistered goats in another class, and the following forty-five prizes will be awarded in the registered class and the same number of prizes will be awarded in the unregistered class, making ninety prizes in all: For first, second and third premiums on buck kid born before March 15, 1902; same on buck kid born after March 15, 1902; same on buck one year old and under two; same on buck two years old and under three; same on buck three years old and under four, and same on buck four years old and over.

First, second and third premiums on doe kid born before March 15, 1902; on doe kid born after March 15, 1902; on doe kid one year old and under two; on doe two years old and under three; on doe three years old and under four, and on doe four years old and over.

First, second and third premiums on aged doe, one buck, one yearling doe and one doe kid. The same list of premiums is offered in each class. First, second and third sweeps take best buck of any age, and doe, and the same in each class.

Free space will be given to all those who desire to make an exhibit of sheep and poultry. The latter exhibits will be entirely independent of the goat show, and this arrangement is made simply to give the sheep growers and poultry raisers an opportunity to show their blooded stock.

The Southern Pacific Company will charge its usual rate on all animals sent to the show for exhibit; but upon presentation of a receipt from the secretary of the association, the company will return all animals to the point from which they were shipped free of charge. The company will also grant a passenger rate of one and one-third fares for the round trip from any point on its lines in Oregon.

Oppose Higher Taxation.

The following resolution was passed by Polk county Pomona Grange, which was held at Lewisville Saturday, December 6, 1902:

Whereas it is proposed that the state aid the 1905 exposition to the amount of 500,000 or more, and no revenue provided to meet it other than by increasing the already high levy upon real property, and whereas very few of the corporations doing business in this state are paying any tax and none of them as much as other interests are paying, yet they are charging for their service all the traffic will bear.

Therefore, be it resolved that we shall oppose any appropriation by the state for said exposition until revenue is provided therefor by taxing other interests and corporations in the same degree as we are taxed, and not increase our already high levy on real property.

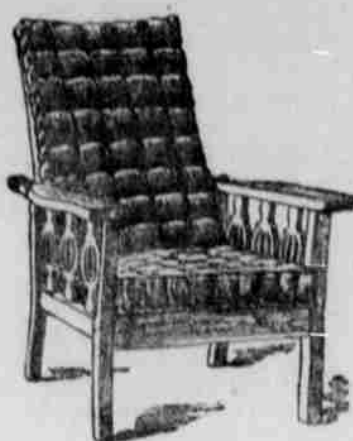
