**Telling Them About Oregon.**

R. D. Cooper, of Independence, Oregon, a large hop grower, is in the city at the Rosslyn, says the Los Angeles Record. Mr. Cooper will remain here for several days and will then go to Arizona to remain until February 1. In speaking of the hop growing he said:

"This year's crop of mine amounted to 50,000 pounds, which I sold to Oregon people at 25 cents a pound. The entire lot was exported. We finish picking the crop in September and market it in October or November and then we are at leisure until February.

"Oregon had nearly half the entire hop production of the United States this year. The quality was excellent and about \$3,500,000 was brought into the state by hop growers. This made things very prosperous in Oregon this year.

"The market prospect for next year's production are good, as there has been a shortage in hops all over the world except in Oregon."
