Andy Turner has gone to work in the Oak sawmill on the West place. He purchased him a new wheel and boards at home.

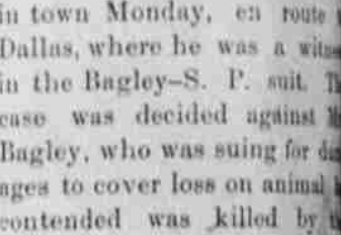
