Settlers' Cross-Examination.

Settlers on timber lands are required to conform to new rules when filing on timber lands. In addition to the old catechism last year the land department formulated a fresh, additional list that commits a settler to searching examination and a positive statement when filing a declaration It virtually means perjury for many people unless they have the money with which to pay for their claims Further, the claimant for land must furnish two witnesses to the effect that he located upon certain described land and visited the corner stakes. The witness must practically swear to the same statements as the claimant makes, Perjury is easy for one, but when three persons have to commit perjury it is not so easy. Formerly the government did not require a claimant to state where he obtained his money with which to pay for his timber claim, but in order to head off the bribing of poor claimants of land by wealthy speculators in timber tracts, the government made the conditions harder. study of the questions now asked of filing claimants at any of the land offices will be interesting. Here they are:

Are you an actual bona fide citizen of this state?

Are you married or single?

Where did you reside prior to becoming a resident of this state, and what was your occupation?

How long have you been a resident of this state and where have you lived during all of this time?

What has been your occupation during the past year, where and by whom have you been employed and at what compensation?

How did you first learn about this particular tract of land and that it would be a good investment to buy it?

Did you pay or agree to pay anything for this information? If so, to whom and what amount?

Have you made a personal examination of each of the smallest legal subdivisions of the land? If so state when and under what circumstances and with whom?

How did you identify said land? Describe it fully.

How many feet board measure of lumber did you estimate that there is on this entire tract and what is the stumpage value of the

Are you a practical lumberman or woodsman? If not how did you arrive at your estimate of the qual-

What do you expect to do with this land and the lumber on it when you get title to it?

Do you know any capitalist or you are certain to be more than pleased company which is offering to purwith the result. For sale at 25c per chase timber land in the vicinity of this entry? If so, who are they and how did you know of them?

> Has any person offered to purchase this land after you acquire title to it? If so, who and for what amount?

Where is the nearest and best market for the timber on this land at the present time?

Did you pay out of your own individual funds all the expenses in connection with this filing, and do you expect to pay for this land with your own money?

Where did you get the money with which to pay for this land and how long have you had same in your actual possession?

Have you kept a bank account during the past six months, if so, where?
