DISEASE GERMS

Some Important and Easily Understood Facts About Germ Diseases.

It is announced in the press dispatches that Dr. Ferguson of London has discovered that lemon juice will kill the bacilli of typhoid fever. The health department of the city of Chicago has taken the matter up and has verified Dr. Ferguson's conclusions and is now experimenting to determine how little need be used for this purpose to render drinking water safe and further to ascertain if citric or other acids may not be substituted.

There is nothing surprising in this discovery; indeed, it might reasonably have been anticipated from the known facts of bacteriology. In the last cholera epidemic in this country it was found that cholera did not prevail along certain streams that carried acidulated waters. Definite experiments were made which showed that sulphuric

acid lemonade was a preventive of cholera, even when the acid was in highly diluted form. The use of lemon and lime juice in the tropics is almost instinctive and its remedial effects have long been recognized. Bacteria do not thrive except in alkaline media. Every biological laboratory understands this. These alkaline conditions are produced in dead and decaying matter, vegetable and animal.

They even exist in the human stomach in periods of fast, after the gastric juice has performed its work and the food supply is exhausted. It is supposed that most of the diseases that make their entry into the human system through the stomach do so when the stomach is empty and neutral or alkaline in its reactions. These remarks would not apply so specifically to the class of diseases introduced by air-breathing, or to those germs received by inoculations, as the yellow fever by the hypodermic lance of certain kind of mosquito, found principally in the tropics. Yellow fever is supposed to be due to a malarial bacilli bred up to a virulent type in the body of the mosquito. There are various examples of the up-breeding, but the specific cause of every type of fever has not been worked out.

There can be no question, however, of the benefit of acid drinks for those maladies, as typhoid and cholera, that find their way into the system through the stomach and no doubt the acid treatment will be found to affect all fevers in which some type of bacilla has come to be recognized as holding a causative relation.
