Every biological laboratory understands this. These alkaline conditions are produced in dead and decaying matter, vegetable and animal.

They even exist in the human stomach in periods of fast, after the gastric juice has performed its work and the food supply is exhausted. It is supposed that nost of the diseases that make their entry into the human system through the stomach do so when the stomach is empty and neutral or alkaline in its reactions. These remarks would not apply so specithose germs received by inoculations, as the yellow fever by the hypodermic lance of certain kind of mosquito, found principally in the tropics. Yellow fover is supposed to be due to a malarial bacilli bred up to a virulent type in the body of the mosquito. There are various examples of the up-breeding, but the specific cause of every type of fever has not been worked out.
