School Land Raised.
At the regular meeting of the pursuance of a docision returned by the attorney general recently, holding the act passed by the last legis lature in valid and not binding upon the board as to the price at which school land should be sold because
school land was omitted from the title, the board madean order fixing the price of school land at \(\$ 2.50\) per acre as contemplated by the Legislature and raising the price of all school lands located within proposed temporary withdrawals for contemplated by law. This decicontemplated by law. This deci sion and order emanated from an
application having been made by ne who wanted to purchase a trac in the reserve, and maintaining that, under the new law the board was compelled to sell the land at 2.50 per acre. The matler was with the result that he rendered a decision holding the act invalid as to schogl land and that the matter rested solely with the Board to fix
any price upon it not less than \(\$ 1.25\) per acre. accept final payments on cersccept
tificates of sale of any state land
onless the certificate accompanied anless the certificate accompanied
the remittance. This is done to prevent the purchaser from sending in final payments and not securing
a deed thereby escaping taxation.
