School Land Raised.

At the regular meeting of the state land board Wednesday, in pursuance of a decision returned by the attorney general recently, holding the act passed by the last legislature invalid and not binding upon the board as to the price at which school land should be sold because school land was omitted from the title, the board made an order fixing the price of school land at \$2.50 per acre as contemplated by the G E Lewis, admr, F A Erixson Legislature and raising the price of nd C A Cray, 19.45 acres, t 7 s, r, all school lands located within proposed temporary withdrawals for G E Lewis, admr, to T J Gardner reservation purposes, to \$5 per acre, as contemplated by law. This decision and order emanated from an son, 13.07 acres, t 7 s r 3 west, \$326 application having been made by one who wanted to purchase a tract of school land in a section situated in the reserve, and maintaining that, under the new law the board was compelled to sell the land at \$2.50 per acre. The matter was submitted to the attorney general with the result that he rendered a Nancy and Kate Wilson to Mary decision holding the act invalid as to school land and that the matter rested solely with the Board to fix any price upon it not less than \$1.25

per acre. The Board also decided not to accept final payments on cer-tificates of sale of any state land unless the certificate accompanied int, 320 acres, t7 s r 3 w; also, 2.01 the remittance. This is done to prevent the purchaser from sending in final payments and not securing

a deed thereby escaping taxation.
