SCHOOL BOOKS USED.

Official List Furnished by Principal Newbill.

School opens on next Monday, September 28th. It is very important that pupils entering school for the first time and others should enter on the first day of the term. Parents can readily see importance of this, as those who enter late in the term will not be able to overtake the others.

Pupils in grades below the ninth should bring their report or promotion cards, as the card assigns the pupil to his grade at once. Those entering the ninth grade should bring their 8th grade diplomas the first day if possible.

School supplies may be purchased during the week before the opening of school.

Those wishing to see in regard to the grading of any pupil or pupils may call at the school building Friday afternoon or Saturday morning.

The following list of books and supplies is for pupils who have not secured them yet. It will be noticed that many of the books may be used by the pupils in different grades.
