It is the purpose of the Krebs Bros. to plow the entire place this spring and set a good portion of it to hops. The acreage to be put in hops will be governed by weather conditions and the character of the soil as found upon thorough investigation.

If the greater portion of the place is set to hops, it means the building of a number more of hop-houses this spring, and the many other buildings necessary in conducting a large hop-yard.

The Krebs Bros. mean to conduct the yard on the same plan as their Marion county yard which means the erection of store buildings, restaurant and lunch counter, concert hall, buildings for pickers, etc.

The Krebs Bros. place will require a much larger number of men and teams than they now have as soon as the weather clears up. The new owners now have nine head of horses and want more.
