20-are Hop Yard In Hop Center of Oregon. George Hiff who came here from Illinois about two years ago, and

who is now a substantial citizen of Independence, has had prepared an estimate on the cost and maintenance of a 20-acre nop yard.

Estimated cost of running hop yard and putting hops in baler ready for market, 61 to 7c per 1b.; estimated yield per acre, 1800 pounds; estimated value of 1903 crop 25c per pound or \$450; net profit per acre, reckoning the market price at 20e per pound, \$143; net profit per acre reckoning the market price at 10c per pound, #63. The expense of running a 20-acre yard up to picking time is about \$300, but this is included in the estimated cost of 64 cents per pound for production. The first crop is raised the second year after the setting of hops, and interest should be figured on investment and expense of working the yard the first year without a crop. No planting is noccessary after a stand is once obtained. Yards are now being cultivated that were set out twen ty years ago.


