

WORK FINISHED.

State Republican Convention Nominates Candidates, Elects Delegates to National Convention and Presidential Electors.

State Central Committee also named and F. C. Baker, present Chairman, Re-elected over Willis Duniway.

On Wednesday of last week the republicans of the First Congressional District in convention assembled at Salem nominated Hon. Binger Hermann. The republicans of the Second District nominated Hon. J. N. Williamson on the same day in Portland. On Thursday the state convention finished up the nominating business and the result of its work is herewith appended as a useful reference:

Supreme Judge—Frank A. Moore of Columbia county.

Dairy and Food Commissioner—J. W. Bailey of Multnomah.

Presidential Electors—J. N. Hart of Polk; James A. Fee of Umatilla; Grant B. Dimick of Clackamas; A. C. Hough of Josephine.

Delegates to Republican National Convention—

At large—H. W. Scott of Multnomah; S. L. Kline of Benton; W. B. Ayer of Multnomah, and Ira S. Smith of Malheur.

First Congressional District—J. U. Campbell of Clackamas and J. M. Keene of Jackson.

Second Congressional District—Charles H. Carey of Multnomah, and N. C. Richards of Baker.

Frank C. Baker was elected chairman of the committee receiving 20 votes to 13 cast for Willis Duniway, his opponent.

Nominations for the nine judicial districts and for the joint legislative districts were made by delegates of the respective districts.

For the third judicial district, comprising Polk, Marion, Yamhill and Tillamook counties, Judge George H. Burnett was re-nominated for one of the judges and B. L. Eddy, of Tillamook, as his running mate. John H. McNary was nominated for district attorney. Judge James E. McCain of McMinnville, made a strong race for one of the judgeships and Russell Wyatt of Albany, had considerable strength in the convention, but the two places could be divided between only two men and they fell to Bur-

nett and Eddy. McNary has been the Marion county deputy for Mr. Hart the past four years and was also deputy under Sam Hayden during the latter's two terms of office.

For joint representative for Polk and Lincoln counties, J. S. Cooper, present mayor of Independence, was selected.
