EDITOR WEST SIDE ENTERPRISE:— Please publish following resolutions rejected by the so-called democratic convention at Dallas last week and let the tax-payers know the position their so-called leaders take in reference to taxation. More anon:

RESOLUTIONS.

1st. Resolved, that we cordially endorse the administration of Gov. G. E. Chamberlain.

2nd. That we demand an honest and economical administration of county, state and national affairs.

3d. We favor a tariff for revenue only.

4th. We favor free schools to enable all scholars to obtain a common school education, but, we are opposed to the appropriation by the legislature of the people's money for a classical education.

5th. We are opposed to the appropriation by the legislature of the people's money to eleemosynary institutions or for any other purpose unless the appropriation is for common schools, the necessity apparent and the constitutionality unquestioned.

6th. That we are opposed to all ship subsidies, and all entangling alliances with foreign nations.

7th. That we are in favor of the payment by the state to the Indian war veterans of '55 and '56 or their widows and heirs of the sum of \$2 per day while they were in the service, and the appraised value when mustered into service of all horses lost by the veterans in service without their fault or negligence. A Vegetable Clock.

One of the most curious plants known is the clock plant, which is a native of Borneo, and even in that country it is said to be rare. The plant derives its name from its peculiar habits, which are known to but few who have not studied the plant from a scientific standpoint. The plant has leaves of two sizes, one of which acts in the capacity of a minute hand, which keeps moving until 4 o'clock in the afternoon, and the other keeps going until morning. The larger leaves act as the hour hands. Starting in a position when the leaves lie close to the stem, with the points hanging down, they rise gradually until they turn toward the top, and then they drop to their former position. It takes the smaller leaves about one minute to go through this performance and the longer leaves just about an hour.

Missouri to the Front.

The Frisco System Magazine has to say concerning poultry: "In Missouri poultry rules the roost. It affords a greater source of income than any other industry in the state. The man who gathers up the statistics of the poultry industry in Missouri has just announced his report. He says that 106,348,308 pounds of surplus poultry were shipped and sold by Missourians in the past year. For this gigantic shipment of fowls the raisers received \$7,193,630. Added to this is the receipt of \$5,377,815 for eggs. Compare this with the income of the farmers from other products and see how the fowl has a right to stand up and crow for supremacy in Missouri. From sheep sold during the year a revenue of \$1,543,000 was derived. Corn brought them \$643,110. Wheat sold for \$7,183,000, within \$100,000 of the amount received for fowls. Naturally hogs sold for more than poultry, as did the big red apples, but excepting these two sources of income the fowl has them all left behind.
